President's Report

Leura P&C Association Annual General Meeting 2018

It has been another busy year. We've continued to provide and enhance valued services, and we've raised funds for resources to enrich our children's learning experience.

Our fundraising initiatives included:

- Athletics carnival, Christmas and Easter cake stalls
- Mother's Day, Fathers' Day and Christmas stock-take stalls
- Newcombe Ball Day and Walkathon sausage sizzles
- Inaugural Clothes swap
- Summer Disco
- Music and Art Showcase dinner
- Kindy Orientation information sessions and afternoon teas
- Meet the teacher afternoon tea
- Tea Towel, Spring bulb, and Bike raffle fundraisers

We improved services to the school community by:

- using the School's 'Skoolbag' app to communicate with parents
- streamlining online canteen ordering
- sourcing alternative suppliers for our uniform items to improve quality and value
- maintaining canteen services via a Canteen Committee and revamping our canteen menu to ensure it meets the Department of Education's Healthy Food Guidelines
- offering Ethics classes across all Stages.

Our fundraising efforts allowed us to:

- fund the relocation of seating, removal of redundant K-2 play equipment and landscaping to improve the outside areas for both infants and primary students
- fund the purchase of 6 sets of age-appropriate wet weather games (eg. board games, construction toys)
- fund the purchase of new reading resources for both infants and primary students
- continue to contribute to individual classroom resources
- finalise our buy-back program of uniform items from the school
- fund some much-needed refurbishment to the canteen (bench and storage spaces).

At our last AGM, we farewell a much-loved Acting Principal, Mr Nathan Smith. We were able to participate in the recruitment and selection of our incumbent Principal, Mrs Elise Berwick.

We welcomed Mrs Berwick and have worked with her to address concerns from both parents and teachers on interruptions to core learning. We reviewed, prioritised and enhanced extra curricular activities for our students. The school planner now better spreads

the number of activities over the year and allows for a dedicated Creative and Performing Arts (CAPA) time.

We also farewelled some long-term and enthusiastic supporters of the P&C: Nikki Martingo and Di Kipp.

Niki has spent many hours assisting our teachers in delivering the art program. She has provided creative advice and inspiration to many initiatives of both the school and the P&C. Niki will, however, be forever remembered for her creation of the 3 sculptures that represent endangered species from our adjacent hanging swamp and which now adorn our grounds: the Blue Mountains Water Skink, the Giant Burrowing Frog and the recently installed Giant Dragonfly as well as the sculpture wall marking the entrance to our Hanging Swamp. We hope to continue to work with Niki over the coming year to complete our sculpture/nature/history trail.

Di Kipp retired from the position of Markets Coordinator after 7 years. We thank her for her tireless monthly efforts in not only raising funds for our school, but in bringing a special service to the local community. To this end, we also welcome Cate Harrison to the position, and are looking forward to celebrating 25 years of First Sunday Markets at Leura Public School later in 2018.

Annual Finacial Report 2017

Overview 2017

During 2017 the assossiation's activities raised \$ 17,911. This was a busy and successful year and we were able to donate over \$ 12,850 back into our school.

We have closed the year with a healthy cash balance of \$40,737.

Funds contributed to school included \$ 1,950 towards the calss budget, \$ 2,400 for the dragonfly sculpture, \$ 8000 for landscaping the playground and moving benches and \$ 500 for the PA system next to the flagpole.

The main contributors to fundraising were general fundraising events with \$ 8,543, the Canteen with a gross fundraising of \$5,371 and the Sunday markets with \$ 4,275 . A breakdown of our fundraising events is given below.
